### DESCRIPTIONS OF PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT TRAININGS & MEETINGS

### 21st Century Summer Symposium

The Summer Symposium features successful strategies that State Educational Agencies (SEAs) and their grantees can use to implement and manage all components of a 21st CCLC program. Attendees will hear from nationally recognized speakers during plenary sessions and work closely with education experts and peers during interactive workshops. SEAs and grantees will gain valuable perspectives on afterschool issues and receive important updates about the 21st CCLC program. Information about the conference dates and location is usually available in late spring.

### Afterschool Ambassadors PLC

The ambassador program empowers up-and-coming leaders in the field to confidently and effectively advocate for afterschool access for all Missouri children. MASN provides training and mentorship to help ambassadors build relationships with federal, state, and local elected officials through in-person meetings, program visits, phone calls, emails, and social media.

### Beyond the Bell Toolkit Training

This training opportunity is geared towards organizations looking to start an afterschool program from the ground up. It is also helpful training for new program directors. The course introduces the resources presented in the Beyond the Bell Toolkit (by the American Institutes for Research). It covers topics such as program design, staffing, communications, records management, program quality improvement, and everything it takes to run a great program.

### CAPSA Peer Learning Community

The Career Awareness and Post-Secondary Access (CAPSA) Peer Learning Community provides support and resources to middle school and high school afterschool programs engaging in college and career readiness/career awareness and post-secondary access activities. As a peer learning community, this group shares best practices and resources supporting students' future hopes and dreams through career pathway planning.

### Civic Engagement Peer Learning Community

The Civic Engagement and Service Learning PLC will share ideas and resources for incorporating civic engagement into afterschool and summer learning programs. Civic engagement focuses on community involvement, leadership skills, and sparking interest in government. Thanks to a generous grant from the National Youth Leadership Council participants will receive expert training in service learning, a process for engaging youth.

### **CypherWorx**

Access to school-age/afterschool-specific training is available through the CypherWorx platform. Training is in an asynchronous online on-demand format and can be completed on a computer, tablet, or cellular device. A selection of courses has been approved for Missouri Clock Hours. Access to the Cypherworx system is available at no cost through MASN.

### Entrepreneurship Peer Learning Community

The Entrepreneurship in Afterschool Peer Learning Community (PLC) provides support and resources to afterschool programs engaging in entrepreneurship education. Although entrepreneurship education is available to all grades, this PLC focuses on opportunities for middle and high school students in out-of-school time programs. As a peer learning community, this group shares best practices and resources for developing a healthy youth entrepreneurship ecosystem around the state.

Missouri Association of Adult, Continuing, and Community Education (MAACCE) Conference If you want to enhance your adult education or community education components, MAACCE is a quality conference to attend in the summer. Sessions for afterschool practitioners focus on the site supervisor or other managers. MAACCE is not recommended for direct service staff, as few activity-related sessions exist. (Approximately 5-8 clock hours available)

### Missouri School Age Conference (MOSAC)

This annual conference brings together around 500 afterschool professionals for keynotes and breakout sessions specific to afterschool. Topics and sessions generally provide information for new, direct service staff all the way through veteran program directors. (Approximately 12-14 clock hours available)

We recommend you budget to send your site coordinators and other staff as you can for this fantastic conference.

### National Afterschool Association (NAA) Convention

The NAA Convention offers a good variety of topics for any level – from direct service to supervisor to system builders to funders. The sessions also have good information for newer staff members. We recommend that experienced staff consider presenting at this conference. Note: SAC funds cannot be used to attend a National Training. 21stCCLC programs must request approval if using grant funds.

### Site Director Orientation Training (SDOT)

The SDOT is an asynchronous training designed to give site directors a strong foundation for leading an afterschool program site, covering topics such as staff management, communication, youth behavior, and more. All site directors/site coordinators must complete the Site Director Orientation Training available through the Cypherworx platform within 90 days of starting the program or within 90 days of starting their employment as a site director/site coordinator. Access to the Cypherworx system is available at no cost through MASN. (7 clock hours available)

### STEM Mobile Lab, Professional Development

Through the leadership and instruction of the STEM Lab Educator, individual and group mentorship will be offered to support STEM enrichment and educational tools found to be successful in afterschool implementation. This mentorship is designed for professionals to gain information related to hands-on use of STEM educational tools, creation of playlists, and general use mentorship and support of STEM.

### STEM Peer Learning Community

The goal of the STEM Peer Learning Community (PLC), supported by a grant to MASN from the Million Girls Moonshot (MGM) initiative, is to equip afterschool educators with the tools to facilitate effective STEM learning. The PLC will focus on expanding content through STEM Playlists and enhancing delivery through Reflective Coaching.

### STEM Educator Symposium

The STEM Symposium is a one-day training opportunity for afterschool program staff to engage in a deep dive into STEM topics and resources on how to teach effective STEM lessons. The STEM Symposium typically has a keynote address and multiple breakout sessions providing information on STEM topics. (3.75 clock hours available)

### Virtual PD Series

The Virtual Professional Development (PD) Series offers virtual trainings throughout the school year. These trainings typically consist of between four and six sessions and are often stand-alone sessions, meaning they don't build on one another and staff can attend without the worry of having missed out on pre-requisite information. The first session will be in the early fall and the series will finish in early spring. (1.5 clock hours available for each session)

### Youth Work Methods (YWM) Training

Youth Work Methods (YWM) Trainings from the Weikart Center for Youth Program Quality can be requested by grantees and are led by the AREs. These 2-hour workshops are aligned with the items of the Youth PQA. They are all delivered using the participatory learning method and give point-of-service staff practical skills they can implement immediately. Topics include Active Learning, Planning and Reflection, Building Community, and many more. (2 clock hours available)

### Youth Work Methods Training of Trainers (TOT)

Would you like to be able to train your staff and volunteers on the Youth Work Methods training yourself? MASN hosts a YWM TOT every few years for program directors, supervisors, and key staff from 21st CCLC and SAC grantees to become certified YWM trainers by the Weikart Center for Youth Program Quality. This training is a significant time commitment, including weekly meetings/homework prior to the multi-day onsite training.

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
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# GET INVOLVED WITH MASN

# DESCRIPTIONS OF OPPORTUNITIES WITH MASN



Afterschool Professionals Appreciation Week is a time set aside to intentionally recognize those working in afterschool programs for the impact they have on students and to show them appreciation and gratitude for the work they put in throughout the school year. In partnership with the National Afterschool Association (NAA), afterschool programs across the state let their program staff know how much they are valued and loved.

### **Director Networking Calls**

MASN facilitates monthly Afterschool Program Director Networking Calls on the 2nd Wednesday of each month. Each opportunity to collaborate will focus on a different topic, announced in advance, so program directors can prepare questions or be ready to share experiences and expertise.

### Lights On Afterschool

Lights On Afterschool is an annual event held in October where more than a million people nationwide gather to shine a light on the importance of afterschool programs in keeping kids safe, helping working families, and inspiring learning. Programs around the state host a wide array of fun events to draw attention to the vital work of afterschool programs.

### Monthly Director's Calls

Join afterschool program directors from across the state on the third Tuesday of each month for an informative, virtual call. Each month, MASN provides information on all things afterschool happening in Missouri. The information often includes funding and partnership opportunities, policy highlights, events and professional development, and a chance to ask questions of your fellow program directors. The first part of the call is geared to all program directors. The second part of the call is specifically for DESE grantee program directors.

### **Regional Directors Meetings**

Afterschool Regional Educators (AREs) will host a virtual gathering of grantee program directors in their area to connect and network with each other twice a year.

### Show-Me Afterschool Day at the Capitol

Show-Me Afterschool Day at the Capitol is a day in February when afterschool advocates from across the state gather at the state capitol building in Jefferson City to educate policymakers about the support that afterschool programs provide for Missouri youth, families, and communities.

### Statewide Afterschool Committees

Join us quarterly to contribute to statewide systems-building work in the areas of Policy and Advocacy, Quality and Professional Development, STEM, and Public Awareness! Committees are open to all afterschool staff, administrators, and community partners. Committees meet virtually once each quarter. Meeting dates and times are published in the MASN Afterschool Pipeline. There is no charge to participate.

### STEM Day at the Capitol

Each year the Missouri Chamber's Math and Science Coalition hosts its annual STEM Day at the Capitol celebration and exhibit. Hundreds of students, educators and business professionals will showcase some of the innovative efforts underway in Missouri to encourage and inspire tomorrow's STEM talent. Afterschool programs can join to showcase how they are contributing to STEM learning and STEM careers.
